What is a Cone Garden

Christian Aid Week 2026 will take place from 10th to 16th May, its focus: supporting families facing extremes of hunger, insecurity and economic hardship particularly in urban Kenya and in Burundi where over 70% of people face hunger and a lack of necessities like clean water and electricity.

In Nairobi cone gardens are helping: Christian Aid's local partner Beacon of Hope is training local people to grow food in seed beds, vertical stacks, multi storied gardens, hydroponics and in easy to manage multi-layered cone - shaped gardens. They are constructed using materials like polythene sheets and recycled paper. Efficient in constrained limited spaces, they are designed to maximise crop yield, improve water drainage and ensure better sunlight exposure. The conical shape of the gardens allows for multiple layers of soil, often 5 or 6, which allow different crop layers to be grown at the same time without expensive and potentially damaging chemicals - particularly beneficial in urban settings.

The shape of the gardens helps conserve water and nutrients which is especially important in this drought prone area. They require minimal gardening time, after planting, and are easy for new gardeners to use, especially if they come with storage tanks and irrigation pipes fitted. The wide variety of green leaved vegetables grown, from collard greens and beetroot leaves to managu- a fast to mature, highly nutritious, black, edible nightshade - is particularly effective in countering malnutrition in children and nursing mothers. 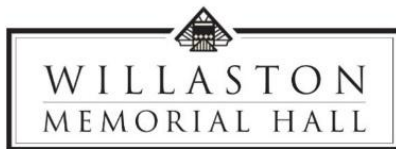

Willaston and District Horticultural Society

May is the time to introduce vibrant bedding plants like marigolds, petunias and fuchsias. However, make sure the risk of frost has passed. Despite the soil holding moisture from winter, newly planted or shallow rooted plants may struggle in the bright breezy conditions of May. Prioritise watering seed beds and sensitive crops like broad beans.

As temperatures rise, greenhouses can quickly become too hot and dry. Ensure good airflow and consider cover for some seedlings.

Membership for the horticultural society gives you 10% off plants at Burleydam, Carr Lane, and both Premier plants which costs £10 per year to join.

We also have a Facebook page and notices on the community boards in the village about what is on.

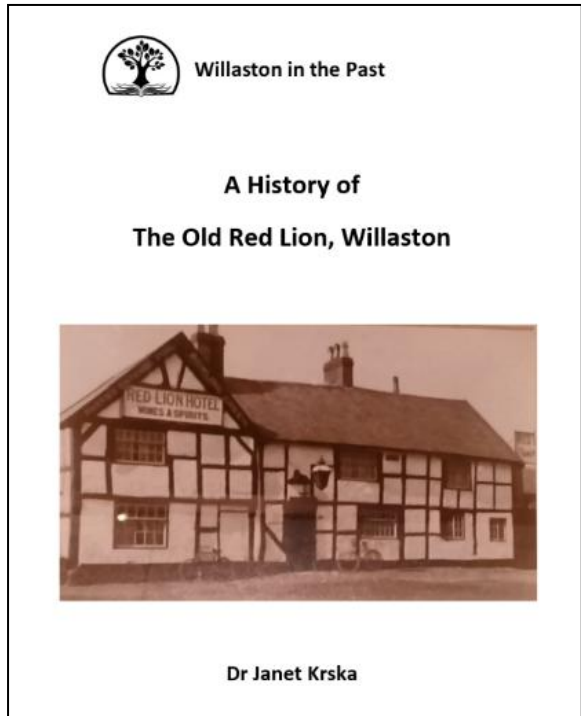
