Faith in the North

2027 will mark the 1400th anniversary of King Edwin, the first king of Northumbria’s, baptism by the missionary Paulinus, Bishop of York. This, his response to the invitation of the Gospel, initiated a turning point which sparked the transformation of the North of

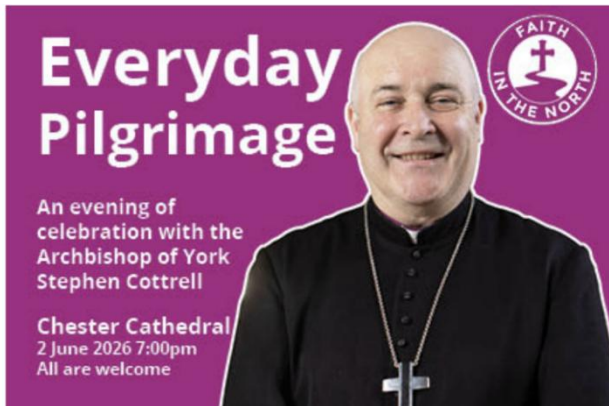
England to Christianity.

A meeting of Christian leaders and scholars at Bishopsthorpe Palace, York, held to discuss how to mark this anniversary, was inspired by the Northern Anglo Saxon missionaries and saints. This led to the Faith in the North initiative.

Faith in the North seeks to encourage a movement of prayer, storytelling and church planting following the example of these Northern Celtic Saints.

It will provide resources for churches, schools and individuals to foster deeper connections with the Christian faith and renew missionary purpose. It considers this mission to be a call to renewal by -as well as storytelling - a sharing of journeys of faith, and inspiration from churches, places and pilgrimages. Archbishop Stephen Cottrell has also expressed the importance of sharing the fruits of contemplation and beauty of God through arts and crafts, poems and music – both through those from the past and through new works.

Faith in the North describes pilgrimage in three ways:

1. a whole life journey,
2. an inner spiritual journey through prayer
3. visiting special places to learn, find forgiveness, healing or guidance.

Based on the early centuries of the church, pilgrimage did not always involve a long physical journey, but also a withdrawal from everyday

life to focus on being close to God. Monks and nuns would have considered themselves on an inner pilgrimage - growing by prayer and meditation.

However, many people today love actively visiting special places to withdraw even momentarily from everyday life and often find sites where others have prayed and worshipped before helpful.

As an alternative to walking specific pilgrim routes, visiting churches, cathedrals and other special places of beauty (such as Lindisfarne and Iona) can give a sense of belonging and perspective. These special places offer space to pause and explore as a pilgrim, having a pilgrim’s experience and thoughts to take time out of the ‘ordinary’ and think about personal journeys through life - finding peace, hope, comfort and understanding. Helpful questions to consider might include, ‘Where have I come from?’, ‘Where am I now?’, ‘Where am I going?’, ‘What might I need to help me cope – and grow?’

Faith in the North has produced a series of guiding leaflets for a church visit. These help people discover and use ‘pause points’ to think about their surroundings by asking the questions above. A few leaflets are currently available at the back of the church – as well as a selection of beautiful contemplative prayer cards inspired by the northern saints.

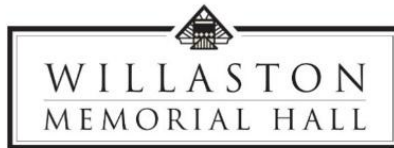

It is lovely to see the Meadow at this time of year, with lots of flowers blooming and the grasses growing. We planted corncockle and red campion at our May volunteer sessions and have more plants to put in.

The birds are in full song, and blue tits are in our new nesting boxes. We have recently put up two bat boxes around Dead Man's Pond.

We were delighted to find that the Great Crested Newts have returned to the pond and laid

eggs in the new grass that is growing there. We were also pleased to see that the Alder Buckthorns planted by Willaston School last year are showing signs of caterpillars – they are particularly attractive to brimstone caterpillars, which is why they were planted.

We have also found some ladies smock, also known as milkmaids or cuckoo flower – this is the official flower of Cheshire!

Our next sessions are scheduled for **Sundays 7th June and 5th July**, weather permitting. Anyone is welcome to join us. We meet by Jackson's Pond at 10.30am and usually work until around noon.

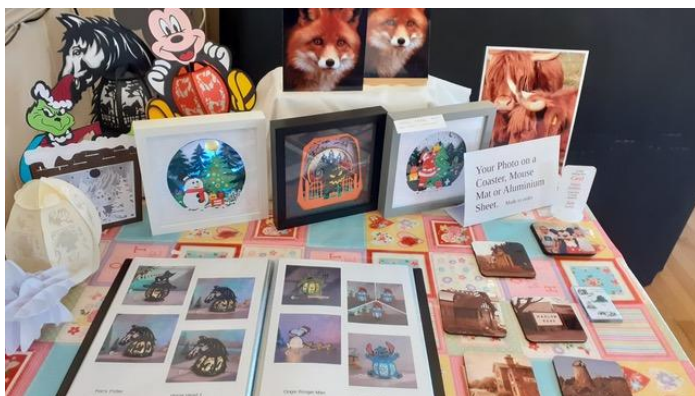

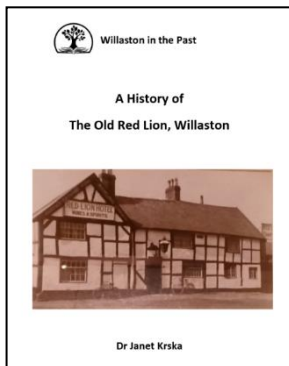
